Town of Indian Trail Breaks Ground on Chestnut Square Park Phase 2A Project

On Tuesday, Feb. 13, Mayor Cohn, Mayor Pro Tem Gay, Council Members Alsobrooks and Buchaluk, and former Council Member Marcus McIntyre broke ground on the Chestnut Square Park Phase 2A project. The project includes:

- Relocation of the existing stormwater pond
- A boardwalk over the pond
- Paved and accessible walking paths
- An additional parking lot
- On-street parking

As Indian Trail continues to grow, we are always exploring how we can enhance the Town's services and amenities to meet the needs of the community.


The Town is also planning Phase 2B for Chestnut Square Park, which will include a multi-use field, field lighting, pavilion shelter, 23-space parking lot, and plaza with a seating area.

Construction on Phase 2A of the project is scheduled to begin in early spring.

The Town of Indian Trail Seeks Public Input on an ADA Transition Plan Project

Public Input Needed

The Town of Indian Trail is undertaking a multi-year Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan project to improve accessibility in all aspects of Town services. A Transition Plan is required by ADA regulations for all municipal entities with more than 50 employees.

“Our Town has always believed that facilities, programs, and services should be accessible to all members of the community,” said Town Manager Mike McLaurin. “A Transition Plan will help benchmark where we are succeeding now and where we need to improve on in the future.”

Key to the ADA Transition Plan process is public input. Community collaboration enhances the ADA Transition Plan by ensuring the focus isn't just on accessibility barriers but also on the lived experience of those with disabilities in the community. Indian Trail community members are encouraged to take the survey below and share it with their friends and neighbors living in the Town. The survey takes approximately 10 minutes to complete.

In addition to public input, the project involves an accessibility barrier assessment of Town-owned right-of-way (ROW), facilities, and parks. The self-assessment of the Town's ROW will include more than 110 miles of sidewalk and five public facilities assessed for accessibility barriers. The Town will also conduct a self-assessment of municipal services to identify those that do not meet current ADA regulations. Following the public input and self-assessment phases, a plan is developed to remediate barriers and improve accessibility for residents.

Street Resurfacing to Begin Soon

Street resurfacing for the FY22/23 Spring Resurfacing contract will begin in March. The contract includes asphalt patching, asphalt milling, resurfacing, full depth reclamation, concrete curb and sidewalk replacement for the following streets:

Concrete and pipe replacement work should begin soon followed by paving the streets at a later date. The project representative will also be placing roadway signs (see image above) 24 hours in advance of resurfacing the streets. Once the signs are placed, there should be NO ON-STREET PARKING the following day.

Spring Shred Day: Saturday, May 11, 2024

The Town of Indian Trail's annual Spring Shred Day is on Saturday, May 11, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. (or until the truck is full) at the Indian Trail Town Hall (315 Matthews Indian Trail Road). The Shred Day is FREE and open to Indian Trail residents. The limit is five boxes per household.

What to Shred: Paper, folders, and hanging file folders.

What NOT to Shred: Hard drives, batteries, cell phones, laptops, CDs/DVDs/Tapes, or hardback books.

Yard Waste Collection Tips and Guidelines

With Spring quickly approaching, it will soon be time to clean up yards and flower beds.

Re-Use Yard Waste First

The Town of Indian Trail collects all types of yard waste; however much of this material can be managed at home and beneficially reused by residents. Utilization of mulching mowers for grass clippings and compost piles for leaves will yield healthier lawns, shrubs and gardens. If you do not wish to manage your own yard waste, the Town will collect the material every other week on your regular collection day.

How to Put Yard Waste Out for Collection

Brush and other trimmings should be stacked neatly next to the curb and should not obstruct the sidewalk or block storm drains. Branches and shrub trimmings should not exceed 4 feet in length and should be less than 4 inches in diameter.



Leaf Collection

- Loose leaves placed at the curb are a violation of Town code and are subject to Code Enforcement and removal penalties.
- Expanded leaf collection (up to 25 bags per pick-up) will be provided during peak periods.
- Leaves should be placed in clear plastic or brown paper biodegradable bags weighing less than 35 pounds each. Bagged materials are collected bi-weekly on your regular waste collection on the opposite week from when you put out your recycling.

Volunteer Opportunity: Storm Drain Marking

The Storm Drain Marking Program helps protect waterways by educating the community on how storm drains connect to streams and lakes. Our goal is to mark every storm drain in the Town, and with your help, this could happen.

With this program, you can volunteer to install the markers yourself or recruit a group of people to help. All you need to do is identify the streets or subdivisions you want to mark and count how many storm drain frames there are.

Over the past two years, thanks to dollars received through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), the Town was able to create surplus general funds to be used for projects to support the community. As part of the Fiscal Year 2025 budget, the Town Council approved the use of additional ARPA-enabled funds to be designated to outside agencies.

The Town will accept agency donation requests for these surplus funds between March 1 and April 12. To submit a request, provide a brief description of your agency and how it helps the Indian Trail community on your organization's letterhead. You will also need to include a description of the project request, how it will support the community, the requested dollar amount, and a copy of your 501(c)(3) federally issued certificate. HITS After Six: Featuring Chris Taylor & the Rumor








Pavement Condition Rating Interactive Map

The Town of Indian Trail's Engineering Department recently released a Pavement Condition Rating Interactive Map that allows the public to view the pavement condition ratings of all Town-owned roads. The map includes all the pavement data received from the most recent pavement condition survey, as well as the updated ratings from the Town's most recent resurfacing contracts.

The Town's goal is to have all its roads at a rating of 80 or higher within the next five years, if not sooner. **To view the interactive map, visit <https://bit.ly/42QFwyV>.**

The map provides a color-coded overview of all the Town-owned roads, a legend indicating what the colors mean, and a pavement condition index or rating for each color. Users can zoom in on certain areas of the Town or search for a specific address to view the pavement conditions.
