## November Bulk and E-Waste Pick-Up

Bulk and E-Waste Pickup is happening this month!

- Nov. 3-7 for Orange Recycling Weeks
- Nov. 10-14 for Green Recycling Weeks

Items will be picked up on your regular recycling day during that time. To find your color week, visit our searchable map at <https://bit.ly/3RhD11x>. You do not need to schedule your pick-up for this service. All items must be placed curbside by 7 a.m. Please call Town Hall at 704-821-5401 within 48 hours of not receiving bulk service so we can send a driver back promptly to pick up your items.

Extra bags of household trash are not considered bulk. Cardboard is not bulk; please dispose of it in your recycle cart.

## FREE Shred Day for Indian Trail Residents

Indian Trail's annual Fall Shred Day is on Saturday, Nov. 8, from 9 a.m. to Noon, or until full, at the Indian Trail Town Hall (315 Matthews Indian Trail Road).

The Shred Day is FREE and open to Indian Trail residents. There is a limit of five boxes per household.

Plastic bags and cardboard boxes cannot be shredded and will be returned to you.

Paper bags can be shredded along with your documents.

## Report a Pothole!

Potholes: everyone's favorite thing to hate!


Did you know? If you see a pothole around Town, you can easily report it right from your phone using the Town's on-line service request system.

If you haven't already, visit <http://bit.ly/3Z7MyMh> and create an account. Once there, you can take a picture of the pothole, mark its location, and submit a repair request to the Town. You'll receive updates on the status of your project, and if the pothole is on an NCDOT-owned road, well report it to them for you.

In addition to potholes, you can also use the service request system to report other issues, such as sidewalk repairs, damaged street signs, and flooding or drainage issues.

If you're unable to use the online service request system, you can always report an issue by calling 704-821-5401 and asking for Public Works. Our staff members are eager to assist you.

Since its inception in 2012, Firefighters for the Cure has helped provide 347 mammograms to uninsured individuals and supported additional contributions to local cancer centers. ## Coffee with the Mayor



# 2025 Property Tax Bills



Town of Indian Trail property tax bills were mailed in September. Property owners should have also received a separate tax bill from Union County.

While payments were statutorily due on Monday, Sept. 1, property tax bills are payable without interest until Monday, Jan. 5, 2026.

Escrowed bills are not mailed to the homeowner but are sent directly to the mortgage company instead. If you would like a copy of your tax bill, please contact the Tax Department at 704-821-5401.

If you appealed your recent property reappraisal with Union County but have not yet received a response, your tax bill will still reflect the reappraisal rate. If the County adjusts the appraised value of your home, they will inform the Town so we can adjust the value in our system and release the difference back to you.
