Administration

- The Business Development Manager position was posted on Wednesday, July 13.
- We are continuing to recruit for an events coordinator, code enforcement officer, and maintenance technician for the streets and drainage crew.
- Met with the Finance Department to review new budgeting software to be implemented.
- A Facebook Live with Mayor David Cohn and Mayor Pro Tem Todd Barber was held on Friday, July 22, at 1 p.m.

Finance

• Staff is preparing for the auditors, who will be here Aug. 1-12.

Parks and Recreation

- Statistics:
 - o 147 rentals during the month of July, totaling 425.75 hours
 - o 319 program participants during the month of July, totaling 831.5 hours of programming
 - 82 applications received and processed during the month of July
- Staffing:
- Recruiting for the events coordinator position has started, and we anticipate beginning phone interviews within the next two weeks.

Planning

- The 2041 Comprehensive Plan was approved, and staff is working on finalizing the documents and mapping to
 post and publish.
- Planning staff is working on UDO amendments triggered by the 2041 Comprehensive Plan and other amendments on our wish list.
- The Downtown Master Plan kick-off and walk through is scheduled for Aug. 2.
- Kimberli's Place (5519 Indian Trail Fairview Road) held community meetings on July 11. This request is scheduled for Planning Board on Aug. 16 and a public hearing before the Town Council on Sept. 13.
- Moore Farm Phase 4 submitted for the third round of site plan review.
- Metrolina Christian Academy submitted for site plan review for a major modification to a previously approved project.
- Slim Chickens was approved and is under construction on Old Monroe Road.
- The property at the corner of Old Monroe Road and Chestnut Lane has submitted for a conventional rezoning from SF-1 to Commercial (GBD).
- The Elan @ Indian Trail tour is anticipated for some time in August based on feedback from the Town Council.



Engineering

- 1st Avenue Phase 2 (stormwater and roadway improvements) The contractor started work on July 19. Door hangers and social media posts were done on July 18 to notify residents. The contractor has 180 days to complete the project.
- FY20/21 Spring Resurfacing Contract The Stallings issue has been resolved, and they should be sending back retainage this week. The project close-out will be next week.
- Indian Trail Complete Street Staff received right-of-way concurrence and reviewed the cost proposal from the right-of-way consultant. Duke Energy is executing the contract for their design.
- HWY 74 Path/Southfork Greenway Staff is contacting property owners in preparation for the easement acquisition phase.
- Watershed Management Plan The study is ongoing. Staff gave an update to the Stormwater Advisory Committee on July 14.
- FY21/22 Spring Resurfacing Contract Staff met with the contractor to mark up all the proposed curb and sidewalk repairs last week. The contractor is supposed to begin curb work on Thursday.
- Shady Bluff Improvements Staff is executing the right-of-way contract.
- Chestnut Square Park Phase 2 Design The consultant got the survey back and is working on laying out park items. Staff has a meeting scheduled on July 29 to go over the rough layouts and any potential issues.
- Indian Trail Complete Street Phase 2 Staff is still waiting on the consultant's proposal/design cost.
- Navajo Trail Extension Project The survey contract has been executed, and work will begin in mid-August. Staff
 is waiting on the contract signature from Geotech. We are reviewing the proposal from the design firm.

Public Works

- Solid Waste:
 - We are actively working with Waste Connections about several issues, including cart placement, co-mingling, and cart delivery.
- Parks:
- The splashpad is open. The splashpad continues to require constant maintenance and associated staff time.
- Staff is working on making a few repairs to the playgrounds that came from our outside playground inspections.
- Windstream cut a water line serving Chestnut Square Park. This occurred while they were installing a fiber optic line that will serve the park with wi-fi and increased security.
- Streets:
- Several street signs were replaced around Town. An inventory of new signs has been ordered.
- Right-of-way maintenance has been performed this week around Town, which includes moving in several locations.
- Stormwater:
 - The FY22 Stormwater maintenance contract is still ongoing. They are 80% complete with the contract.
- Buildings/Grounds:
 - Several HVAC issues are being worked on throughout several of the buildings the Town maintains, including Town Hall.
- Fleet:
- The Town received a new vehicle within Public Works this week that will be placed into service in the next few weeks.

Public Works Continued

- Public works is down 40% of its overall workforce. This has, and will continue to, delay projects until we are able to staff back up.
- We are working on long-term projects related to Hwy 74, Town Hall, and park upgrades.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

- The ARPA Committee continues to meet on a weekly basis.
- Staff talked with County staff about the water line project. Staff is working to schedule a community meeting about this project.
- We have received referrals from several Council Members concerning possible projects. We are following up on those referrals.
- Staff is working with the three nonprofits that Council approved funds for at the July 12, 2022, Council meeting.
- The first payments have been processed for the three ladder trucks as approved by Council.
- More detailed ARPA information will be presented at the August 9 Council meeting.
