



Town Council Meeting Recap

April 8, 2025

Presentations

- Council on Aging
- Union County Crisis Assistance Ministry

Approved

- The requested increase in the fee to \$275 per hour for attorney services for Fiscal Year 2025-2026.
- To schedule a hearing on the possibility of a censure of Council Member Barber during the May 13 Council meeting. This is in response to the independent investigative report regarding Council Member Barber and The Indian Trail Weasel Report Facebook page.

Discussed

- Law Enforcement update from Captain Andy Mullis.
- Director of Engineering Todd Huntsinger provided an update on the latest progress on the proposed future overpass at Rocky River Road and Highway 74. The City of Monroe recently passed a Resolution to initiate the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Amendment Process for the Rocky River Road & US 74 Grade Separation Project. The proposed project would improve connectivity between communities and industrial and employment centers.

Manager's Report

- The Town is working with Union County to plan a celebration for the completion of the Emerald Woods waterline project. The tentative date is April 28 from 4-6 p.m. in the Emerald Woods neighborhood. We will provide additional details as they are finalized.
- The Town Manager supports training for staff for both hard and soft skills. As such, several staff members recently participated in Customer Service Training. We would also like to congratulate Senior Accounting Technician Paula Beachum on earning her Accounting and Finance Certificate from SPCC last month.
- Several new businesses are working on locating in Indian Trail, including a Chase Bank next to the new Harris Teeter Fuel Center.
- Planning staff are monitoring the variety of House and Senate bills that have been filed related to planning and development. Staff will make the Council aware of any significant legislation.
- During ongoing field investigations, staff have observed an increase in residents leaving carts on the street for extended periods after collection. Staff will begin sending letters to individual residents about proper times to place and return carts from the road.
- At the upcoming **April 22 meeting**, the council will hear presentations from a new business and KeyStep, a non-profit organization, hear the SWAC Annual Report and a quarterly financial update, discuss the ADA Transition Plan and the Rogers Road/Wesley Chapel Road intersection improvements, and vote on an interlocal agreement for critical intersection improvements. These items are subject to change.
