



Town Council Meeting Recap

February 10, 2026

Presentations

- New Business: The Peach Cobbler Factory

Discussed

- Law enforcement update from Captain Andy Mullis.
- **Union County Critical Intersection Update:** Director of Engineering Todd Huntsinger presented two alternative conceptual designs for the Old Monroe Road/Hayes Road/Faircroft Way intersection. A 30-day public outreach period will begin in early March. A virtual public hearing is scheduled for March 19.
- **Solid Waste Contract:** Council Member Todd Barber discussed the possibility of extending the existing solid waste contract between the Town and Waste Connections for an additional two years. The Town Council, via consensus, instructed Town Manager Adam McLamb to inquire with Waste Connections about extending the contract.
- **Winter Storm Gianna Update:** Town Manager McLamb provided an overview of the Town's process for handling winter storms before, during, and after the events, including specific data related to Winter Storm Gianna. He also discussed current operations and planning for future storms.

Approved

- Entering into an interlocal agreement with NCDOT in the amount not to exceed \$385,000 to construct the betterments within the Old Monroe Widening Project. These betterments include pedestrian sidewalks on the north side of the corridor and metal traffic poles and pedestrian poles with powder coating.
- The Resolution of Intent to close a portion of Keowee Circle between Old Monroe Road and Cherokee Lane in the Rushing Park subdivision. The public hearing to discuss the closure is scheduled for the March 24 Council meeting.

Appointed

- Richard Sayre to fill the unexpired term for Seat 4 of the Planning and Zoning Board.

Manager's Report

- Town Manager McLamb will be setting up meetings with the Council Members to discuss Parks and Recreation projects, including the results of the Community Center feasibility study, which is scheduled to be presented in March.
